Objectives in spending PPG:

Raising Attainment and achievement of pupils to at least expected progress through:

- i) Provision to raise English, Maths & Science levels, with a particular focus on writing.
- ii) Providing social & emotional support / interventions to improve attendance and behavior and to impact on children's wellbeing, including a wider range of enrichment opportunities.
- iii) Further enhancing curricular opportunities school visits; residential trips in years 3, 4, 5 & 6; extra curriculum activities, enrichment to include additional focus on drama, competitive sport, outside learning and forest schools and support with uniform, materials etc
- iv) Personalised learning one to one tuition; additional small group interventions; before school /after school holiday booster groups, emotional support as appropriate in appointing pastoral manager.
- v) Establishing SHINE school on Saturday providing enhanced curriculum and enrichment opportunities
