Plan Overview 2017/18
<p>Pupil Premium is funding that is allocated to pupils who are currently eligible for free school meals and who have been eligible for free school meals at any point in the last six years. This equates to approximately 25% of the school population. These pupils are also categorised in national data collections as disadvantaged.</p> <p>The funding enables the school to extend its provision so as to maximise potential through additional supporting staff in class distributed across the full age range of the school and thereby strengthening support for children. Nationally, disadvantaged children achieve less well compared to other pupils. There is a large gap in the attainment nationally between pupil premium children and non-pupil premium children in all key stages. Pupil premium funding has been given to help schools close this gap. The impact of this funding is measured and shown in the evaluation.</p> <p>Pupil premium pupils over the past few years have performed very well at Crowland. However, we remain totally committed to continue to raise the achievement of all pupils, and as far as we are able, aiming to narrow the achievement gap between disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged pupils.</p>
